## SCRUB program for 2006

Douglas Acres Neighborhood Association will not be having a separate Scrub Day this year. Instead the City of Des Moines will have both the Metro Waste Authority's Metro Transfer Station and the Compost Center open several Saturdays this summer and fall.

◆ Both facilities will be open from 7 am to 1 pm on each of the following dates:

May 13, 2006 August 16, 2006 June 10, 2006 September 16, 2006 July 22, 2006 October 7, 2006 October 21, 2006

- Both facilities are open to residents of Des Moines only. Proof of residency (photo ID or current utility bill) is required.
- No commercial haulers: Commercial haulers are required to haul to the metro park east landfill.

The Metro Transfer Station is located at 4198 Delaware Avenue.

### Items allowed:

General Trash: furniture, lawn mowers without fluids, televisions, computers.

Appliances (disposal fee \$10 cash): air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, microwaves, dehumidifiers, furnaces, stoves, washers, dryers, dishwashers, water heaters, etc.

Tires

Items NOT allowed: Car batteries, propane tanks, toxic liquids such as oil, paint, etx, toxic or hazardous chemicals. Call the Metro Waste Authority's Regional Collection Center at 515-967-5512 for disposal information.

The Compost Center is located at 1601 Harriett Street.

This facility allows disposal of the following items: yard waste containers, brush, tree limbs (24" diameter or less, maximum length 10'), loose grass clippings, straw and hay.
