### First Scrub Day of 2014 on March 15

The first Scrub Day for 2014 will be on **Saturday, March 15**. The MWA Transfer Station at 4198 Delaware Ave will be open from 7:00 am to 2:00 pm and Des Moines residents can drop off trash, furniture, televisions, tires, lawn mowers (with all fluids drained), and appliances. The Compost Center at 1601 Harriett (just north of the Des Moines River and east of SE 14th St) is also open from 7:00 am to 2:00 pm and residents can drop off yard waste, including grass clippings, leaves, tree branches, etc. Please remember to bring proof of Des Moines residency (driver's license or current utility bill).

# Free Little Libraries Come to DANA

Douglas Acres Neighborhood Association has purchased 3 *Free Little Libraries* that will be installed in yards as soon as the ground thaws. Please visit the website <a href="https://www.freelittlelibrary.com">www.freelittlelibrary.com</a> to learn more about this program.

Free Little Libraries are designed to encourage literacy and help neighbors become more involved with their neighborhood. The library itself is a small weather proof box mounted on a post and is usually installed in a front yard near the public sidewalk. As children or adults walk past the library, they can borrow a book and are expected to return the book when they are finished reading it. Many of us have books and magazines lying around the house that we can use to get the library started.

We are starting with 3 libraries and are deciding on the locations where they will be installed. We'd like to expand this program and if you would like to donate money toward purchasing a library, please let one of the Board members know. If you are able to build a *Free Little Library*, either for your front yard or to sell to DANA, let a Board member know. There are many plans available at the website listed above. We could also use someone with some artistic talent to help paint and decorate the libraries.


